Anatomy of In-town Hunts

It was brought to my attention that some members still have questions about the fees we charge for our monthly hunts, so let's break it down.

The amount we charge is based on the amount of money we spend on targets.

If we spend \$200 and have 10 hunters, the cost of the hunt would be \$20.

The price of silver is down right now so a dime is running about \$1.80. If we put 500 dimes in the hunt, the cost would be \$900. If we plan on 30 hunters the fee would be \$30. If more than 30 hunters show up, we put \$30 per additional hunter into the field. We have dimes or other targets on hand to account for additional last-minute hunters. Our goal has always been to put ALL hunt fees in the ground. The monthly hunts are not held to make money, they are held to have fun and potentially recover your hunt fee back in targets. The club has started a coin drawing at each hunt to recover the cost of the food provided at the hunt. This eliminates the need to pull money from the general fund for food. We still appreciate those who bring desserts or additional side dishes to share.

If less than 30 hunters show up, the

club will spend more money on targets than will be collected from hunters and therefore lose money on the planted targets. In order to better control costs, we have started to request that hunters sign up ahead of time for hunts.

The board will be working on putting together a more formal explanation of in-town hunts and the fees charged to be distributed to all members and to be included in the new member packet.

- Jewelry:** objects of metal often set with gems and worn for personal adornment, except jewelry qualifying for the GOLD category.
- Coin:** a piece of metal issued by governmental authority as money (includes GOLD coins of any nation).
- Token:** a piece resembling a coin issued as money by some person or body not of a governmental authority; can be redeemed for services or specified items.
- Artifact:** simple object showing human workmanship or modification.

John C found this watch among grass roots in standing water in a Boulder park. He shook the watch and it started running, so he figured it was real. A jeweler was fooled for awhile then ruled it a fake.

Chicago License Badge



This 1897 Express Chicago license badge 3218 was found at the same construction site (with permission) Roy was hunting. Cindy was using her MXT with a 6" x 3" coil in an area that had been dug down 8-10 feet revealing the pre1900 soil layers.

COIN - John Olson

1787 Connecticut Cent



John stated "I found this east of Denver..." He found the 1787 Connecticut cent in New Hampshire with his White's V3i with the double D Eclipse coil. He was having a great day finding 18th century buttons when out of the ground came a green "button". Rubbing the dirt off revealed the details of a long lost coin. His first US 18th Century Coin.





In-Town Hunt Information

As a Eureka! member we want you to participate in and help put on In-Town club hunts. These hunts are meant to be fun, first and foremost. They provide a context outside of the meetings for fellowship with club members. To put on an in-town hunt you need to:

- Schedule with the Hunt Coordinator or President (see the contact list).
- Provide the Hunt Coordinator a plan.
- Send the hunt flyer to the newsletter editor in an appropriate format for insertion into the newsletter (see the contact list).
- Provide flyers at the monthly meeting.
- Ensure the hunt rules are discussed BEFORE the hunt.
- Police the hunt.
- The hunt master for any particular hunt can decide open hunt (non-members may hunt) or members only.
- Write a story for the newsletter and send it and accompanying photos to the newsletter editor prior to that month's deadline.

To ensure the continuation of this hobby and to provide the best impression of Eureka! and its membership, you, as hunt master, MUST enforce all rules, including:

1. Pouches to store finds and trash MUST be worn and used at all times during the hunt.
2. All hunters must wear headphones.
3. Absolutely no tolerance of holes left open. A first warning, followed by a time-out or expulsion from the hunt.
4. Hunters digging and leaving trash of any sort on the hunt field will receive the same treatment discussed above.

All hunts will need to be okayed by Hunt Coordinator (see the contact list) prior to officially being put in the newsletter and put on.

Failure to follow the guidelines may result in hunts being cancelled.





Hunt Rules

3. Headphones must be used.
4. Every hunter must have a bag or trash pouch for properly disposing of litter and unwanted items that are encountered.
5. All trash items or unwanted items ENCOUNTERED are to be placed in your trash pouch or bag. If a hunter encounters a trash item too large to carry call the huntmaster to retrieve the item or take it to the side of the hunt field. Do not re-bury or discard the unwanted item. Hunters caught re-burying or tossing aside unwanted items will be ejected from the hunt (no refunds).
6. All holes must be properly filled; failure to do so will result in only one warning with any repeated offense will result in disqualification and ejection from the hunt in progress (no refunds).
7. The areas we will be hunting is pasture with scattered rocks and boulders. The use of small relic or garden spades will be allowed, no full sized (no.2) spades allowed.
