## Lord of the Rings Hunt Report

June 26, 2016 turned out to be a perfect day to hold an Eureka! Treasure Hunters Club hunt. The "Lord of the Rings" hunt was headed up by Boots Lewis and held at the Lewis' Lazy Heart Ranch north of Golden, Colorado. The \$50 entry fee also included a pig roast!

Boots began preparing for the hunt by securing rings, coins and prizes and a pig. He and Laura hosted the board meeting and later a planting party at the bunkhouse prior to the hunt which was attended by Jeff Lubbert, Chris Davis, Steve Rex, Terry Weatherly, and Ron and Linda Erickson. Ron also cut weeds to make a beginner's hunt field area. Planters were treated to a beer and pizza party and a little rain.

Nancy Faires and John Cornelisse signed members up for the hunt and took the fees at the regular

meeting and checked them in on arrival.

The entry fees and were used to purchase over 1,000 targets and some donated items were also added. Targets to find included: 564 rings, 100 Rosie dimes, 100 Mercury dimes, 45 sliver Washington quarters, 150 buffalo nickels, 58 wheat pennies, some Indian head cents, 24 prize tokens, a Spyderco token and some additional coins and tokens.

Prizes included a ring sizer, finger mandrels, ultrasonic cleaners, magnifying loupes, a *Lord of the Rings* Frodo figurine, a diamond tester, ring boxes, *Western & Eastern Magazine* subscriptions, and \$20 in Gold-N-Detector tokens.

Early Sunday morning, Boots and Jeff began preparing the pig and got the coals going. Chuck Hedberg came by and helped out with whatever was needed.



In the afternoon as people arrived, they finalized their strategy on which detector to use and which coil would be the best for the deep grass. Fresh batteries, sunscreen and bug spray were commonly seen. A tip card for a gold coin was going.

Around 3 pm, everyone gathered at the hunt field. Thirty four hunters listened to the rules after Jay Reed loaned out a pair of headphones to help out when a pair wasn't working. There was a mowed area for beginners or those who might need to a break from the high grasses and uneven ground.

Huntmaster Boots began the hunt, and the quest to find rings, silver and tokens was on. The field was large and soon the hunters were spread far and wide.



Members were soon finding rings and assorted targets. As other hunts had been held at the Lazy Heart earlier, an

interesting array of items was found.

While searching for targets, the surrounding scenery added to the hunt. Besides grasses, there were rocks, bushes, cactus, cow pies, road apples, thistles, wild roses, bind weed, wild flowers, irrigation ditches and many other plants. The sky was blue with floating white clouds and the sun was heating us as we listened for the sounds indicating good targets.



During the two hour hunt, Win Faires delivered water to the hunters in the field while Chris Davis oversaw the



**FIND-OF-THE-MONTH CATEGORIES**

**Gold:** natural gold (flakes, nuggets, wire) stamped karat alloy content or obvious custom alloy item, except gold coins which are entered in the Coin Category.

**Jewelry:** objects of metal often set with gems and worn for personal adornment, except jewelry qualifying for the Gold Category.

**Coin:** a piece of metal issued by governmental authority as money.

**Token:** a piece resembling a coin issued by some person or entity, not of a governmental authority (with the exception of tax tokens), that could be redeemed for services or specified items. Advertisement tokens with no redeemable value are entered in the Artifact Category.

**Artifact:** simple object showing human workmanship or modification, and all other items that do not meet the criteria for other categories.






# In-Town Hunt Information

In-Town club hunts are meant to be fun, first and foremost. They provide a context outside of the meetings for fellowship with club members. To put on an in-town hunt you need to:

- Schedule with the Hunt Coordinator or President (see the contact list).
- Provide the Hunt Coordinator a plan.
- Send the hunt flyer to the newsletter editor in an appropriate format for insertion into the newsletter (see the contact list).
- Provide flyers at the monthly meeting.
- Ensure the hunt rules are discussed BEFORE the hunt.
- Police the hunt.
- Decide if the hunt is a members only or an open hunt (non-members may hunt).
- Write a story for the newsletter and send it and accompanying photos to the newsletter editor prior to that month's deadline.

To ensure the continuation of this hobby and to provide the best impression

of Eureka! and its membership, you, as hunt master, MUST enforce all rules, including:

1. Pouches to store finds and trash must be worn and used at all times during the hunt.
2. All hunters must wear headphones.
3. Absolutely no tolerance of holes left open (a first warning, followed by a time-out or expulsion from the hunt).
4. Hunters digging and leaving trash of any sort on the hunt field will receive the same treatment discussed above.

All hunts will need to be okayed by Hunt Coordinator (see the contact list) prior to officially being put in the newsletter and put on.

Failure to follow the guidelines may result in hunts being cancelled.

Hunts may be paid for in advance. This helps the hunt master with planning for how much should be planted in the field. In case a person must miss the hunt, their prepaid fee may be refunded if they call the hunt master before the hunt and cancel, other circumstances will be reviewed. No refund will be given for just plain failure to show up to the hunt.
